Dr. Phillips has been a long time faculty member, and now leads the New York Simulation Center for the Health Sciences (NYSIM) as the Assistant Dean of Simulation Education at NYU Grossman School of Medicine. In addition, she serves as the Director of Graduate Medical Education (GME) Quality and Safety for NYU Langone Health. Her focus areas are High Reliability Organization transformation, and ensuring that NYULH meets the Accreditation Council of Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) expectations for house staff engagement in quality, safety, communications, and teamwork. Dr. Phillips has developed curricula in communications skills, professionalism, and clinical reasoning that incorporates simulation and workplace assessments for orthopedic residents. Dr. Phillips is working toward integrating simulation into all levels of education across the NYU Grossman School of Medicine as well as the City University of New York to increase quality, safety and patient experience.

Dr. Phillips is a Clinical Professor of Orthopedic Surgery and Pediatrics, specializing in Pediatric Orthopedic Surgery. She completed medical school and two years of general surgery at Baylor College of Medicine. She completed her Orthopedic Surgery Residency at Indiana University and a Pediatric Orthopedic Fellowship at Texas Scottish Rite Hospital. Dr. Phillips came to NYU in 1995. 

NYSIM Updates: COVID-19 Precautions Continue

As we continue to expand operations, this month NYSIM would like to highlight some key elements of our increased safety and sanitation measures. We are committed to supporting safe operations for all learners, faculty & staff. Please note the following operational changes in order to support safe operating procedures:

1. All educational programs will require an intake or re-intake that may or may not require a redesign to keep faculty, learners and staff safe
2. All individuals entering Bellevue Hospital (therefore NYSIM) will require a temperature check in the Bellevue Lobby
3. All individuals will be required to wear a surgical mask at all times. NYSIM can provide a surgical mask if an individual is not wearing one
4. All individuals will be required to follow good hand hygiene
5. All individuals will be asked to practice social distancing when possible
6. All individuals will be asked to report directly into the simulation rooms. The lobby is closed.

Clean your hands often with soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer. **Do not touch your face.**


