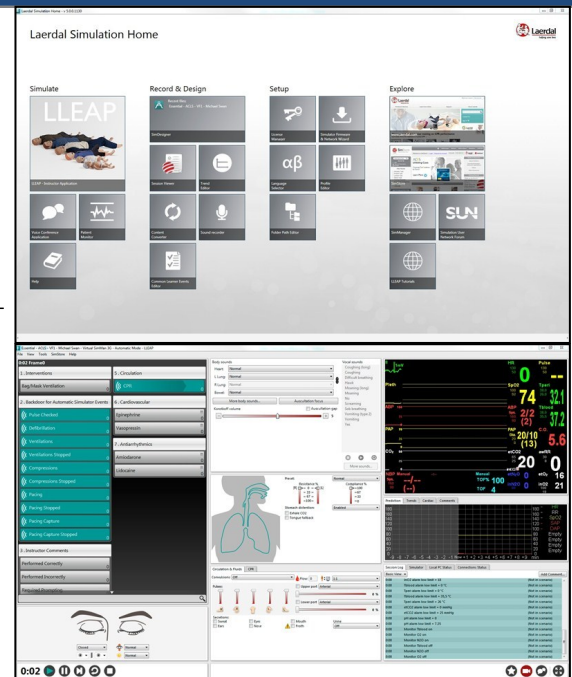
New Equipment: Laerdal Simulators upgraded to LLEAP Platform
